CARE GUIDE


Taking good care of your belongings makes good sense. It prolongs their lifespan, which is good for your finances as well as the planet. Follow our care guide and keep your things beautiful and usable for many years to come.

DINNERWARE - STONEWARE & PORCELAIN

Stoneware and porcelain are sturdy materials burned at high temperatures. The higher the temperatures, the sturdier it gets – and our stoneware and porcelain are burned at very high temperatures above 1200° C. As long as you take certain precautions, our stoneware and porcelain are dishwasher, oven and microwave safe and can also go in the freezer. But never put normal stoneware and porcelain into a preheated oven or directly from a warm oven onto a cool tabletop. Big temperature differences might cause it to crack and break, which is why it should always be heated up and cooled down slowly.

GLASSES - SODAGLASSES

Our ordinary glasses are made of soda glass, which is easy to care for. Just follow our care guide – and make sure not to drop them on the floor – and your glasses will stay beautiful and useable for many years. You can easily wash your soda glasses together with dishes and cutlery, as long as you choose a short cycle with temperatures below 55° C. Apart from that, we recommend that you follow our care guide for crystal glasses.
